

MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Charlotte Drummond Memorial Scholarship Foundation

The Charlotte Drummond Memorial Scholarship is a legacy scholarship that keeps the spirit of Charlotte Drummond and her dedication to Catholic education alive. In 2019-2020, we're awarding one \$2,000, one \$1,000, and one \$500 scholarship.

The Foundation is also proud to announce an inaugural \$1,000 CD Alumni Scholarship for a student who is a legacy of Cardinal Dougherty (a student whose grandparent, parent, or sibling attended Cardinal Dougherty High School).

Application Requirements

- Eligible candidates must be rising juniors or seniors attending a Philadelphia Archdiocesan High School who demonstrate the following qualifications:
 - Financial need
 - Involvement in the school community
 - Written recommendation from a teacher or guidance counselor
- Candidates who receive a recommendation from a teacher or guidance counselor must submit the following application materials **in one PDF or Zip File document**:
 - Application form (attached)
 - Two formal Letters of Recommendation (one from teacher or guidance counselor recommender; the second from another teacher, administrator, or mentor)
 - List of school activities, honors/awards, and work experience (resume)
 - 500 Word Essay that answers the following question: "How have you made the most of your Catholic Education? Please include examples of activities you are involved with and how these have impacted your educational experience."
 - High School Transcript (can be unofficial)
- All above materials must be submitted to drummondscholarship@gmail.com before **March 18, 2019**
- All applications will be reviewed by the Foundation Scholarship Committee. The Committee may request additional information throughout the review period (outlined below).

About Charlotte Drummond

- The Foundation was started to honor Charlotte Drummond, who taught for 40 years at Cardinal Dougherty High School (Philadelphia, PA), and another 5 years at Cardinal O'Hara High School (Springfield, PA).
- Charlotte oversaw Student Council and the Yearbook, among many other activities and events, during her tenure at Cardinal Dougherty.
- In summer 2013, Charlotte was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease. She fought a courageous battle until her passing on March 23, 2016.
- Charlotte had a lasting impact on hundreds of alumni from both Dougherty and O'Hara, which is evident in thousands of photographs personally taken over four decades.
